The annual Contemplative Outreach conference was held on September 29 – October 2, 2011 at the Marriott Waterfront Hotel in San Francisco, CA. What a Conference! What a setting! The days by the city on the Bay were filled with Open Forums, Workshops, and Presentations. Saturday, an Enrichment Day for the area, brought in 330 centering pray-ers in addition to the 250 people who attended the entire Conference. I found the Presenters on Saturday to be of special interest because four of the five of them were about forty years old and younger. They individually spoke about scientific studies of the effects of meditation on the brain, a study of healing responses to everyday stress in prayer group members, and educating minds and hearts of the next generation (college students) in contemplative prayer. The person, Rev. Vincent Pizzuto, Ph.D., who teaches college students and is ordained in the Celtic Christian Church was particularly enthusiastic. His contact information is www.newskellig.org.

As I reviewed notes taken at the Conference, here are a few ideas and quotations that may be of interest to you, too. In a video message from Fr. Keating, he said:

- “Contemplation – there is nowhere to go to get it; there is nowhere to go to get away from it, it just is. Contemplation refers to the evolution of the human spirit and hastens that evolution.”
- “In centering prayer there is a silent hymn or hum embracing solitude and experiencing oneness. The person shares love with the whole world to transform it into the mind and heart of God.” – Gail Fitzpatrick Hopley
- Centering prayer is not a prayer practice for the second half of life! Fr. Keating began the practice of contemplative prayer as a young man. Now he is revered.
- How is Christ’s light refracted in you? Our uniqueness is the way Christ—the love of God – comes into the world.

Contemplation is *being over doing*.

CENTERING PRAYER

7-day Intensive Retreat and 7-day Advanced Intensive Retreat at St. Benedict's Abbey and Retreat Center June 23rd through June 29th 2012

Intensive Centering Prayer retreats immerse participants in the practice of Centering Prayer as taught by Contemplative Outreach, Ltd. The Intensive and Advanced Intensive retreats will be separate, but participants will come together for prayer, liturgy and meal times.
